Our School History





Our founder, Blessed Nicolas Barré, was born in Amiens, France, in 1621. When he was in Rouen, France, he saw how the poorer families lived. Many children, especially the girls, were litterate and had no knowledge of God. Seeing the disparity in opportunities for education between the rich and the poor, he was inspired to establish schools to educate girls.

The Sisters of the Holy Infant Jesus (k) Sisters) was established in Singapore in 1854 when they set up the first Convent of the Holy Infant Jesus (CHILI) school at the corner of Bras Basah Road and Victoria Street. Despite the limited resources, the sisters started classes for children, took care of abandoned children and became beacons of hope to the increasing number of families who sought support and solace. CHILI Our Lady Queen of Peace (CHILI OLOP) became the seventh school founded by the IJ Sisters in 1955 and is now one of the eleven schools belonging to the congregation. Since then, the school has nurtured and educated girls from all walks of life.

In 1666, Father Barré invited some women to form a community to continue this educative work in those days, educating the poor, especially girls, was frowned upon by society. The women, in a spirit of total trust in God's guidance, said a wholehearted 'yes' to this invitation. Thus, he began a new religious congregation: the Charitable Mistresses of the Schools of the Holy Infant desus.

We firmly believe in the importance of a holistic education that extends beyond the classroom. The IJI motto "Simple in Virtue, Steadfast in Duty" also guides the school in what we do. The school continually seeks to improve its physical infrastructure and facilities so as to provide a better environment for our students to learn and develop their potential. With a team of dedicated staff and the continued support of our parents and partners, our students will scale greater heights and grow up to be confident young ladies.





CLIMB is a whole-school Character Education Programme that, aims to develop our students to be enthusiastic learners, humble leaders, and gracious ladies it uses The Virtues Projectim as a tool for values inculcation. It consists of 52 virtues that are Gifts of Character, e.g. Purposefulness, Resilience, Humility, Responsibility.

These 52 virtues are aligned to the school's values and are taught explicitly through CLIMB sessions, and Lifeskills/Catechism lessons.

Parents, as partners in education, learn about The Virtues Project^{IM} when their children enter the school. This enables the same approach to be adopted at home, and the language of virtues reinforced.

STEM in Sustainability @ CHIJ OLQP

Our ALP aims to promote authentic and practice-oriented learning experiences. It seeks to foster in our students the ability to integrate interdisciplinary knowledge and exhibit varied levels of metacognition. Programmes such as Makerspace and STEM in Sustainability equip our students with the fundamentals of computational thinking, inventive thinking, and critical thinking skills.

P3 and P4 students learn basic programming concepts through the use of programming software such as microbit. They apply the codes learnt to devise coding-based solutions to solve real world problems pertaining to food and energy sustainability.





Maker Education in CHW OLQP creates opportunities for our students to come together and solve problems through free play. Makerspace@OLQP provides a learning space for our students to ideate, tinker with digital or physical fabrication tools to construct objects during their free time at recess. The exciting activities promote joy of learning, and our students are encouraged to think out of the box to solve problems creatively.








Academic Programmes

English Language

Mother Tongue Languages

We create an environment that develops students' interest in their Mother Tongue Language (MTL) and culture. There are various activities, such as speech and drama lessons, language cultural camps, class competitions, learning journeys and celebration of festivals, which encourage our students' use of their Mother Tongue. The highlight of the year is the MTL Fortnight which is very much handson; and through these experiences, a better understanding and appreciation of the different languages and culture are developed.

Mathematics

We aim to develop our students to become confident and creative problem-solvers with thinking, reasoning, communication and metacognitive skills. We cultivate the joy of learning Mathematics and foster interest in the subject through meaningful and enjoyable learning experiences. Mastery of the subject is achieved through performance task, investigative work, journaling, and Mathematics trails. Through these activities, students will acquire. Mathematical concepts and skills for everyday use by inking and applying what they have learnit to life.



We adopt the Inquiry-Based Learning and Differentiated Instruction pedagogies in the teaching of Science. The Science Department advocates a growth mindset in teaching and learning. Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) and Maherspace activities are infused into the curriculum where students practise the virtues of perseverance and resilience. We also foster a strong partnership with external agencies to provide platforms for our students to showcase their talents in speaking, demonstrating the concepts learnit, creating craft and doing their part in contributing to society.

Physical Education

We aim to provide our students with opportunities to develop strong physical literacy and instill values in them through the PE curriculum and other planned physical and sports activities in our school. We have a structured approach that promotes regular physical activities and sports excellence, thus fostering the physical and character development of our students. To promote a richer student experience in inculcating an active and healthy lifestyle, we also work closely with external organisations to extend students' learning beyond the curriculum.



Our Art Education aims to equip our students with knowledge and skills in both the Visual and Performing Arts and develop them to be confident advocates of the Arts. Through our Art and Music curriculum, as well as other planned programmes and activities, we provide our students a structured approach that nurture them to reach their creative potential Arts Education in our school promotes a holistic learning environment that goes beyond academic achievements. It instills values and reinforces 21st Centuru Competencies so that our students are future-readu.





Co-Curricular Programmes

To complement teaching and learning in the classroom, enrichment programmes, learning journeys and co-curricular activities are conducted. These activities enhance student learning as they allow for greater exposure and experiences beyond the classroom. The co-curricular programmes provide opportunities for character building and leadership and talent development. In tandem with the holistic development of our students, our Primary 3 to Primary 6 students are strongly encouraged to join a Co-Curricular Activity (CCA). We have a range of CCAs covering 4 areas, namely Physical Sports, Clubs and Societies, Visual and Performing Arts, and the Uniformed Group. These CCAs help our students discover their talents, interests and potential, build friendships, promote social integration and cultivate a sense of belonging in our school.
